Sugar Moon Farm Visit & Lunch

Indulge your senses in the magic of maple as you start the day with a visit to Sugar Moon Farm where you'll learn about the process that brings syrup from tree to table. Then, you'll get to savor the flavors of Nova Scotia—including syrup tapped on site—at a delicious brunch before continuing your trip to Prince Edward Island.



Ferry to Prince Edward Island

Your journey along the Trans-Canada Trail continues as you board a ferry that will take you from Caribou, Nova Scotia to Wood Islands, Prince Edward Island.



Wood Islands Lighthouse Visit

Disembark the ferry and begin exploring the southernmost point of the Trans-Canada Trail that spans Prince Edward Island. Discover the diverse heritage and legends of the Maritime coastline on a tour of the historic 3-story Wood Islands Lighthouse, which was

completed in 1876. While on the island, you'll also learn about the area's sea life and sea glass that combine to create a unique aquatic ecosystem.

Junior Adventurers can channel their inner-Mary Poppins as they create sea glass-inspired paper kites, before sending them soaring into the sky.

Junior Adventurer Dinner & Movie Night

Morning On Your Own Time at Hotel

Lunch & On Your Own Time Avonlea Village

Stroll the streets of Avonlea Village, a replica of the quaint community at the heart of the "Anne of Green Gables" stories. Avonlea—the fictitious name Lucy Maud Montgomery gave to Cavendish—is home to historic buildings from the author's life, including the original schoolhouse she taught in and the 1872 Historic Long River Church, in addition to replications of houses and shops from the time of the novels.

Then, tantalize your taste buds with a delicious lunch of regionally inspired lobster rolls and

bistro-style fare at one of the locally owned restaurants you discover during your exploration or ask your Adventure Guides for a recommendation.

“Anne of Green Gables” Museum Experience

Immerse yourself in the literary setting of author Lucy Maud Montgomery’s popular “Anne of Green Gables” novels that capture the charm and spirit of 19th century Prince Edward Island.

- Tour the historic home-turned-museum dedicated to Lucy Maud Montgomery.
- Roll up your sleeves and participate in planting and digging potatoes—just as Anne’s adoptive family did in the novels, and as Prince Edward Island residents take pride in doing to this day.
- Enjoy a jaunty carriage ride with “Matthew Cuthbert”—the gentleman Anne thought of as a kindred spirit—around the property overlooking Anne’s “Lake of Shining Waters.”
- Sip tea with a member of current Campbell family members, whose family own the home. Lucy Maud spent much of her childhood visiting this home and was affectionately known as “Aunt Maud” by her cousins.

Private Dinner & Entertainment at Local Restaurant

Celebrate the natural and traditional flavors of Prince Edward Island as you learn the region’s unique culinary stories at a local restaurant. As you dine, you’ll be entertained by local musicians who will perform traditional regional tunes that are tied to the island’s Celtic heritage.

Cape Jourimain Stop

Make a brief stop to take in the sheer beauty of Prince Edward Island's pastoral landscape of rolling hills and pristine forests. Visit the point connecting Prince Edward Island to New Brunswick via the Confederation Bridge, a truly magnificent feat of Canadian engineering that spans the often-ice-covered waters along the Canadian coast. Take in the tranquil scenery that seamlessly blends the industrial marvel of the Confederation Bridge with the marshes that signify the beginning of the Trans-Canada Trail's path westward.



Shediac Lobster Boat Experience & Lunch

Cruise the calm waters of Shediac Bay for a first-hand experience of lobster fishing in the north Atlantic. While on board, you'll learn about the sustainable and responsible fishing practices used to protect the local environment and lobster populations. You'll also hear stories from a lifelong lobsterman as they share tips and tricks for preparing your own delectable lobster meal.

Get cracking and dig into an onboard fisherman's feast featuring locally sourced, succulent lobster (or non-lobster meal if preferred).



Dinner & Evening On Your Own in Moncton, New Brunswick

Stop in at one of the gastropubs or restaurants in Moncton's downtown area to get a taste of local flavors, culinary creativity and the warm hospitality the people of New Brunswick take pride in.

Following dinner, stroll through Moncton's Riverfront Park, another portion of the Trans-Canada Trail that celebrates the region's Celtic heritage.

Hopewell Rocks Park Guided Exploration

- Enjoy a privately guided tour for an exploration of the exposed ocean floor of the Bay of Fundy during the low tide of the world's highest tidal cycle.
- Get up close and personal with the Hopewell Rocks, or Flowerpots Rocks, whose unique formations are the results of millennia of extreme tidal erosion.
- Hear tales surrounding the origin of Hopewell Rocks.

Afternoon at Broadleaf Ranch Activity Options

OPTION A:

Tidal Kayaking at Hopewell Rocks

Paddle along the rising tides of the Bay of Fundy for an active and brisk guided kayaking adventure around Hopewell Rocks. See important details

OPTION B:

Broadleaf Ranch Saddle & Paddle

Take to the trails for an exploration by horseback, then canoe down the river at Broadleaf Ranch on this epic adventure.

OPTION C:

Broadleaf Ranch Pedal & Paddle

Coast through forested trails on a bike, then take to the water and navigate the river at Broadleaf Ranch in a canoe.



High Tide Observation

Relax and reflect on the dramatic changes in the Bay of Fundy as you observe the landscape following the arrival of high tide.

Millbrook Cultural Center

Spend the morning immersed in the culture and traditions of the Mi'kmaq people through workshops and ceremonies that will bring the story of this proud nation to life.

- **Guided Tour of the Cultural Heritage Center:** Learn the story of the Mi'kmaq people through their traditions and rich history.
- **Private Discussion:** Engage in a private discussion about the current culture and experiences of the Mi'kmaq people.
- **Talking Stick Workshop:** Discover the significance of the talking stick and how its history as an instrumental tool in keeping order and teaching respect for others. During this workshop, you will select your own stick and personalize it using beads, paint, natural leather ties and feathers to make it your own.



Lunch at Masstown Market

Visit this local market where you'll enjoy a simple and hearty lunch featuring flavors of the region. You'll also shop in the market which is filled with shelves of locally produced crafts and goods—which make excellent souvenirs to remind you of your adventure.

Salt Marsh Exploration & Junior Adventurer Scavenger Hunt

Continue your exploration of the Trans-Canada Trail as you hike along a renovated railway trail that is surrounded by tranquil wetlands.

During your exploration of the Salt Marsh, Junior Adventurers will be keeping a sharp eye on the environment around them as they participate in a wildlife and special sights scavenger hunt.



Lunch & Early Afternoon On Your Own in Halifax

Venture out into Halifax to discover a new favorite place for a delicious lunch. Dine along the waterfront at local cafes and bistros whose dishes can only be enhanced by the breeze off the harbor.

After lunch, enjoy the serenity of the Halifax Public Gardens or find inspiration at any of the local art installments as you explore the city.



Tall Ship Silva Sailing

Take to the sea as you set sail on a 130-foot schooner to explore some of Halifax Harbour's most notable landmarks. Constructed in Sweden in the 1930s, M/S Silva spent over 70 years afloat as a cargo ship in Northern Europe before entering Canadian waters in 2001. The vessel still retains the same profile of billowing sails she had upon her initial launch.



Private Farewell Reception at The Tap Room

Gather together with your fellow Adventurers in a restored 1800s warehouse, turned into a charming nautical-themed pub to say farewell to the amazing Canadian Maritime provinces. The Celtic inspired entertainment will set the perfect tone to the waterfront area as you savor another amazing meal of hearty Nova Scotia style and flavors.
